- 4. Students' Report –student President Michael J, Grade 12
  - Michael outlined the configuration of the student council with 24 students from Grades 8-12, including how student reps are elected from each grade.
  - The students are organizing a Halloween carnival and possibly a dance.
  - Michael explained that student clubs include a huge variety of subjects, such as foods, decorations and Harry Potter. The students may start advertising in school newsletter so students know what is available.
- 5. Principal's Report Principal Chris Atkinson
  - Tech it Away is Wednesday, Oct. 19. Kitsilano Secondary is one of three tech sites in city for the public to drop off tech items for recycling.
  - Job Action Not much has changed since last report. Teachers are still volunteering tine for after school
    activities, but no report cards are being done, except for Grade 12s, and there are no teacher-parent
    meetings. Parent-teacher night is cancelled. Parents can get more information from the Labour Relation

  - Chris reported a total of 90 international students are enrolled, up 10 from last year.

# 6. Treasurer's Report

## **Gaming Money**

Kitsilano Secondary has a total of \$31,660 in gaming money available for the 2011/12 year and there was a total of \$74,870 in teacher requests. Cathy allotted funding recommendations to the various departments according to the requests, need and historical grants.

Discussions about the gaming money recommendations resulted in the following changes with the balance of \$6,960 to be allocated at a future PAC meeting:

#### **Athletics**

Rubber flooring in weight room - \$3,600 deducted.

## Other departments

Counselling - \$3,000 for safe teen workshops reduced to \$1,100. These can be funded primarily by the school.

## Clubs

GSA - \$200 for GSA increased to \$300.

Bike Club - \$500 for bike club taken out. This amount to be dealt with at the school or district level.

MOTION: Gaming funding of \$24,700 be approved.
